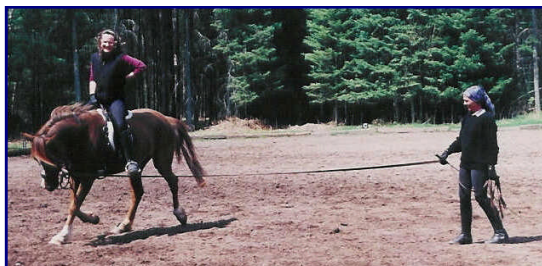


WHY A MORAB ?

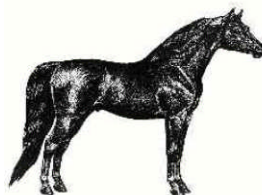

Historic Horses Bred to do the Job

Morab horses have been bred since the 1800's. In 1920, William Randolph Hearst coined the word "Morab" and bred a number of Morabs to work the rugged terrain surrounding the Hearst Ranch in San Simeon, California.



The Hearst bred, Morab Stallion, Antman.

Able to transmit their distinguishing characteristics for many generations, Morabs are a TRUE BREED not just a nice cross between Morgan and Arabian horses.

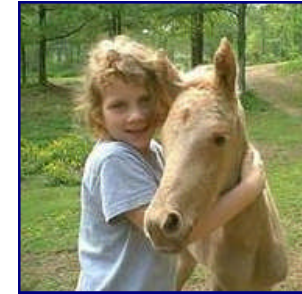
Even third and fourth generation Morabs will closely resemble first generation Morabs.
